Class Text: 'Where the wild things are' by Maurice Sendak.

Weeks 1, 2 & 3: Narrative using our class text. We will be extending our vocabulary by exploring the meaning of new adventurous words, focusing on the use of openers that draw you in. We will imitate and innovate the story with the support of 'talk for writing.'

Weeks 4, 5 & 6: We will be using imperative verbs to write instructions to teach other children how to make a hand puppet.

Science/ D & T: This term we will be learning about Light and shadows. We will use our learning to create our very own hand (shadow) puppets. We will be designing our own puppet based on our class text and practising our sewing skills to create our amazing puppets. Come to our sharing afternoon to take a look at our puppets and stages!
