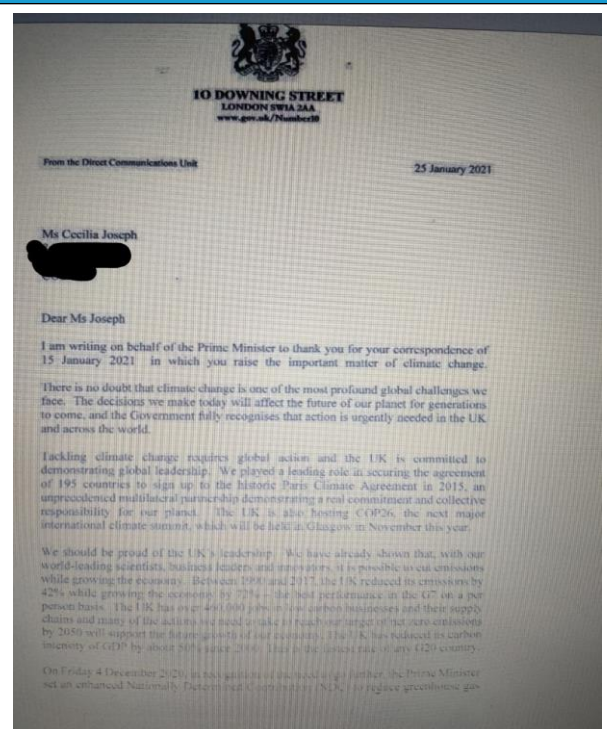
I am writing to tell you about pollution. During your speech in the House of Parliament, we were told that you would try and make this world a better place. Ever since, no changes have been formed. It is vital for this change to happen due to the fact it causes our problems.

Firstly, pollution endangers the earth and affects climate change. The pollutants have built up in the atmosphere and caused small changes in its composition. Although these changes are small, they have a very big effect. Primarily through burning fossil fuels, people have released huge amount of carbon dioxide into the air. This has made a big difference in how much carbon dioxide is in the air, but it still is just a small part of all the gases in the Earth's atmosphere. Effects of pollution on the Earth include environmental deterioration, impacts on the health of living organisms, global warming, depletion of the ozone layer and reduced efficiency or infertility of farm lands and crop fields. The sources of pollution vary widely, and so do its effects. Pollution affects all areas of the Earth, including the water, soil and atmosphere, on microscopic and macroscopic levels, causing immediate harm or long-term damage. As you can see we are making the corruption worse and it has to stop.

Secondly, it kills plants and animals. It is appalling to hear trees have been cut down. They are protect us during climate change yet we are cutting it down. Trees breathe carbon dioxide and breathe out oxygen. For every tree we cut down and burn is going to let the carbon dioxide out. Human industrial and commercial activity cause air pollution, and this can damage plants both in the short and long term. Although air pollution has decreased in most of the developed world due to strict regulations and controls designed to improve air quality, pollution is still a significant problem in the developing world. Ammonia, nitrogen dioxide, sulphur dioxide and ozone are the biggest air pollutants affecting plants. Most animals thrive in areas that have good plant growth. However, when pollution takes place, plants may start dying off. If, for example, an industry poorly disposes of toxic chemicals, the vegetation cover in the region may be affected. Once vegetation reduces, animals will have nothing to eat and may begin starving. Animals do a lot for us (etc. give meat, milk, eggs...) and treating there part of life like there are no animals hurts. They do a lot for us and that is why some people take them into a loving home. We need some respect for animals. We can not leave them there to die. Even though they can not speak, you can imagine what they will think about us.

Thirdly, it can diseases. This is important subject because some diseases do not have any cures. You can get Lung cancer, Cardiovascular problems, Neurobehavioral problems, Asthma, Chronic Obstructive Pulmonary Disease (COPD), Mesothelioma, Pneumonia, Birth Defects, Lower Respiratory Tract Infection and Stroke. The extent of exposure to the pollutants can determine the degree of the disease and infection. It has been found that pollutants in the air can lead to premature deaths owing to different reasons such as asphyxiation and extreme reactions caused by the body to the pollutant matter.

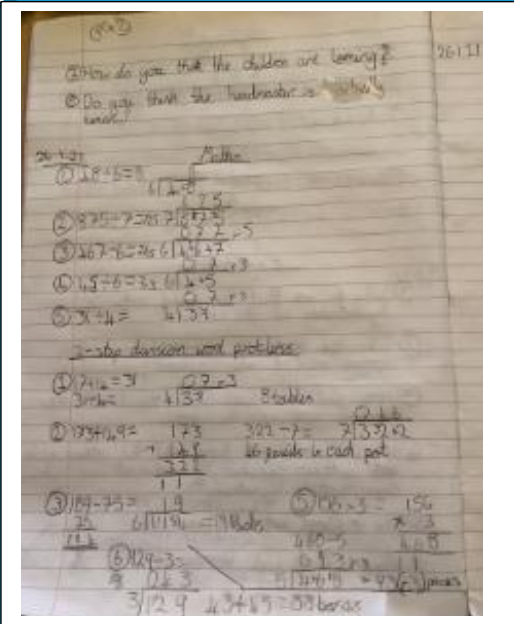
Jack Brennan Year 2
