Beaux worked really hard in his basketball training and earned a fantastic medal! Great practising Beaux!



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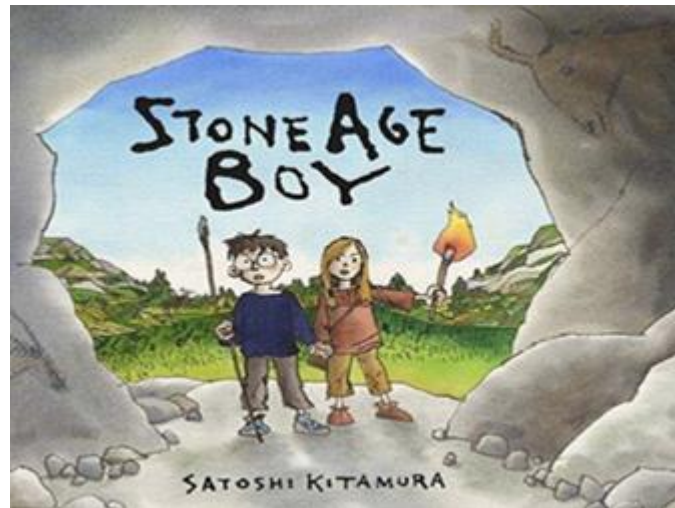

It has been so lovely getting to know the year 3 children and seeing both year groups work together on collaborative tasks to kick start the year and create a positive, happy learning environment.

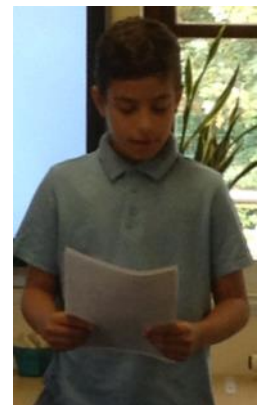


Elm
