Maple class have been enjoying learning about the Anglo-Saxons. They have learned about the invasion of Britain, and they have also studied Anglo-Saxon place names and their meanings.

Max made up a name for his Anglo-Saxon Village, it was 'Maxfield' which means 'the field of Max'. Connie called her village 'Conniecroft', which means the small enclosure of Connie, and Elijah named his village 'Elijahbury' which means 'fortified place of Elijah'.

We have also started reading Anglo-Saxon Boy by Tony Bradman. It is an exciting story and there is a lot of action to come for Maple!

It has been a busy start for Elm class over the last two weeks. We have started to learn the topics for all our lessons.
